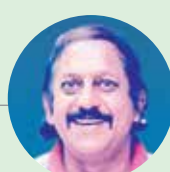

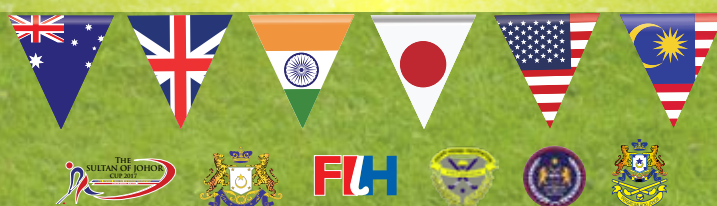

STATE GOVERNMENT continues Financial Support for Sultan of Johor Cup



The Johor State Government once again showed that it cares and gives priority to sports in the state for a healthy lifestyle by leading the list of sponsors with a RM500,000 contribution to the seventh edition of the Under-21 Invitational International Tournament.

Since the inception of the tournament in 2011 the Johor Government has never failed to sponsor the annual event which has become a tourist attraction, both, for locals and foreigners.

The invitational tournament is sanctioned by the FIH (International Hockey Federation) and is the only Under-21 hockey tournaments that is played annually. The only other Under-21 tournament is the Junior World Cup which is held every four years.

The other teams are 2015 champions Great Britain, Japan and host Malaysia. Malaysia were the first winners of the majestic silverware when the tournament was inaugurated in 2011.

The next two highest sponsors were Astaka Padu, a well-known award-winning property developer

in Johor and Radio Television Malaysia (RTM) with RM200,000 each. RTM is once again the host broadcaster of the prestigious tournament.

His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar was on hand to receive the sponsorships in a glittering ceremony held at the Tanjung Puteri Hall, Persada Johor International Convention Center, Johor Bahru on Sept 25.

Accompanying His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim was Johor Chief Minister Datuk Seri Khaled Nordin, Johor Hockey Association president Datuk Md Jais Sarday, who is also the Johor State Executive Councillor for Local Government and Housing, Johor State Executive Councillor for Youth and Sports, Datuk Zulkurnain Kamisan.

Also present was Johor State Secretary YB Datuk Hj. Azmi Rohani plus host of other dignitaries including JHA deputy president

A total of RM1,790,000.00 was raised at the event. Other main sponsors were Johor state government's investment arm JCorp, Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB), UEM, JBB Builder (M) Sdn Bhd, Genting Berhad, UM Land, and Atlan Holding Berhad (Yayasan Warisan), – all with pledges of RM100,000 each.

SAJ Holdings, Berjaya Times Square, Malakoff Corporation Berhad, Iskandar Waterfront, BCB Berhad, pledged RM50,000 each and Global Tobacco Manufacturers Sdn Bhd came in with RM40,000.



Malaysia became the first holders of the Sultan of Johor Cup, beating Australia 3-2 in the final while Germany edged India 3-2 for the title in 2012. India, however, laid their hands on the impressive silverware by beating Malaysia 3-0 in the final in 2013.

India also wrote tournament history as the first team to win the Sultan of Johor Cup twice after defeating Great Britain 2-1 in the final in 2014 and in the process became the first team to retain the title. Great Britain were the champions in 2015 and Australia won it in 2016.

His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim practises multiracialism and stands together shoulder to shoulder with his beloved Bangsa Johor to achieve the best for the state.

This year's Kembara Mahkota Johor

was also unique that the Royal Family travelled in 12 Morgan Three-Wheeler cars imported from the United Kingdom.

Joining the Royal Tour for the first time was His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim's son-in-law Dennis Muhammad Abdullah who is married to Tunku Puteri Johor Tunku Aminah – the only daughter of Sultan Ibrahim and Permaisuri Raja Zarith.

Others in this year's Kembara Mahkota were Tunku Ismail, his wife Che' Puan Khaleeda Bustamam, Tunku Temenggong Johor Tunku Idris, Tunku Panglima Johor Tunku Abdul Rahman and Tunku Putera Johor Tunku Abu Bakar.

The History of Sultan of Johor Cup



The handmade RM100,000 silverware is made of sterling silver, crafted and designed in London



The world acclaimed Sultan of Johor Cup is the brainchild of two sports loving Royalties in Malaysia – His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim Ismail Ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar the Sultan of Johor and His Royal Highness Tengku Abdullah Ibni Sultan Ahmad Shah, who is now the Regent of Pahang.

The birth of the Sultan of Johor Cup Under-21 Invitational Tournament in 2011, which is an annual tournament – has since become the pride in the world of hockey – as it is the only other tournament for juniors apart from the Junior World Cup which is played every four years.

This has made the Sultan of Johor Cup a much sought after silverware. The majestic handmade silverware was specially crafted and designed in London at a whopping cost of RM100,000 and is made of sterling silver.

The tournament gives the juniors another avenue to showcase their hockey skills apart from the Junior World Cup.

It is an invitational tournament but there is never a year when the organisers have to turn down requests from many hockey playing nations as it will remain a six-nation tournament for now.

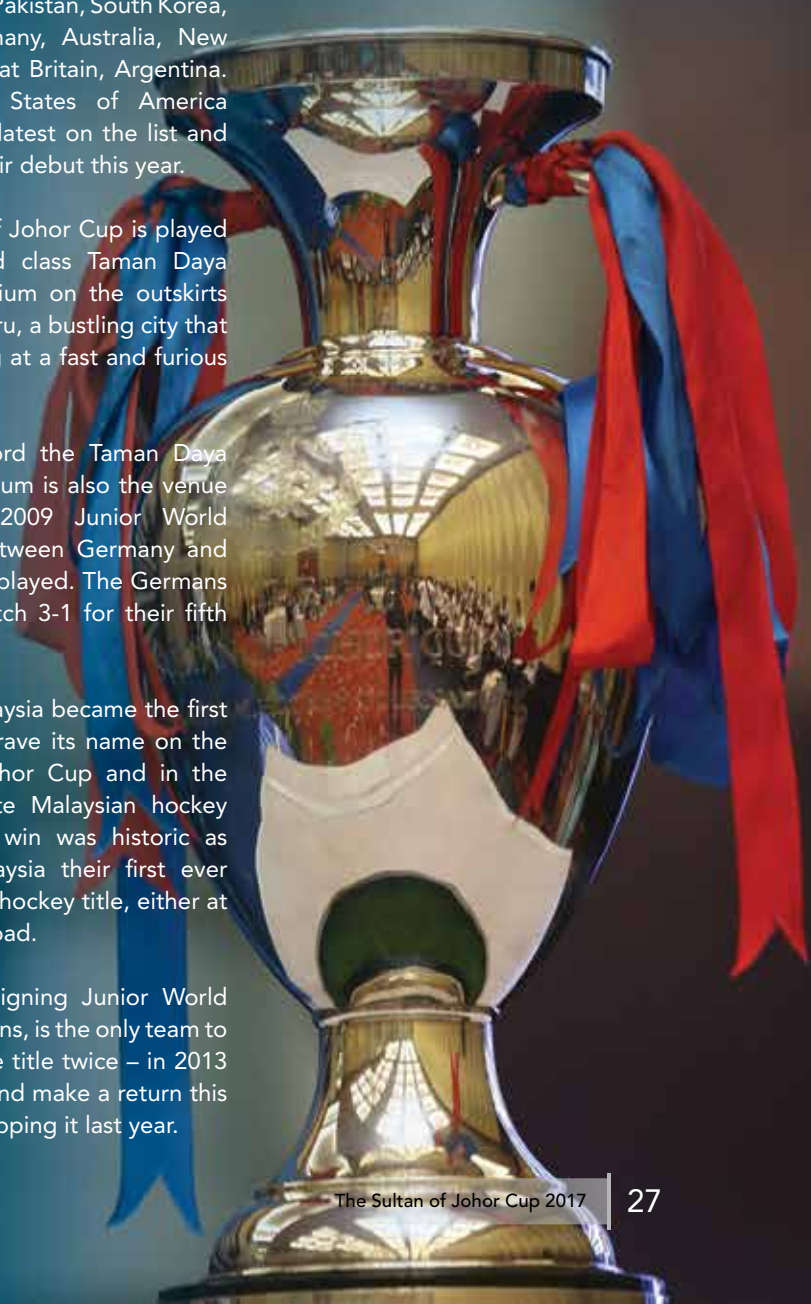
Apart from hosts Malaysia five other nations are invited. So far nations that have taken part in the annual tournament are Asian giants India, Pakistan, South Korea, Japan, Germany, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain, Argentina. The United States of America (USA) is the latest on the list and will make their debut this year.

The Sultan of Johor Cup is played at the world class Taman Daya Hockey Stadium on the outskirts of Johor Bahru, a bustling city that is developing at a fast and furious pace.

For the record the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium is also the venue where the 2009 Junior World Cup final between Germany and Holland was played. The Germans beat the Dutch 3-1 for their fifth world title.

Fittingly Malaysia became the first team to engrave its name on the Sultan of Johor Cup and in the process wrote Malaysian hockey history. The win was historic as it gave Malaysia their first ever international hockey title, either at home or abroad.

India, the reigning Junior World Cup champions, is the only team to have won the title twice – in 2013 and 2014 – and make a return this year after skipping it last year.





Johor Football to have a new RM2 million state of ART STADIUM in 2018

Record breaking Johor Darul Takzim (JDT) - winners of the Malaysian Super League football title for the fourth successive time this year - will have a new home in 2018 - a state-of-the-art RM200 million stadium.



Named Sultan Ibrahim Larkin Stadium, the 40,000 capacity stadium is being built by Country Garden Pacificview (CGPV) and is part of the JDT Sports City in Iskandar Puteri.

The JDT Sports City will also house hotels, apartments, shopping malls, rugby, tennis and futsal facilities.

The 70,000 square meters stadium is being built on 35 acres of land and will be managed by the club itself.

The Southern Tigers have established themselves as the most successful and consistent team in the Malaysian League and clinched their fourth Super League title since 2014 - a feat no other team in the M-League has achieved since the inception of the Malaysian Super League in 2004.

Apart from the League titles JDT have also won the FA Cup, the Charity Shield and topping the list is winning the AFC Cup in 2015 with a 1-0 win over FC Istiklol of Tajikistan in the final played at the Pamir Stadium in Dushanbe - the only team from Malaysia to achieve success at Asian level.

The new stadium is another chapter for JDT - owned by Johor Crown Prince Major General Tunku Ismail Sultan Ibrahim who is also the newly elected president of the Football Association of Malaysia (FAM).

JDT's present home is the Larkin Stadium - which is the home of the Southern Tigers - and draws capacity crowds each time JDT plays at home, both at national and international level.

The new stadium - inspired by the banana leaf - is not only the pride of JDT and Bangsa Johor - but another feather in JDT's cap. It features FIFA standards, including FIFA standard natural grass field plus advanced sound and live broadcast systems.

The Sultan Ibrahim Larkin Stadium will also house the new headquarters of Johor FA.

The exterior design of the new stadium is one of modern and neat concept. The exterior facade of the stadium consists of LED lighted surface that can illuminate in different colours according to a statement posted on the Southern Tiger facebook.





Prosperity Dragon

is the latest tourist attraction in **YONG PENG**

Johoreans are proud to add another tourist attraction in the state – RM8 million dragon tunnel at the Che Ann Khor Moral Uplifting Association grounds in Taman Kota Impian in Yong Peng, Batu Pahat.

At 115m it is the world's largest and longest dragon tunnel in the world. Launched by His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim Ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar in November last year the dragon has been pulling in the crowds, both local and foreign.

The gigantic dragon tunnel is more than just boosting the tourism industry in this southern state. Aptly dubbed the "Prosperity Dragon" it is adorned with Chinese cultural and religious paintings and is a symbol of prosperity for Johor.

The 107m long beautifully crafted structure is between 3.6m and 4.8m high and has 144 steps inside. The belly of the dragon is fully air-conditioned and can sit 500 people. Everything about the structure is related to number nine – which represents prosperity and luck for the Chinese community.

Ancient Chinese folklore has it that people who enter from the dragon's mouth and exit from its tail will enjoy good luck and will be able to ward off evil.

The fortune dragon in Yong Peng is the first of its kind in Malaysia and has drawn tourists from as far as New Zealand, the United States of America, Australia, India and is also very popular with Singaporeans.

Yong Peng is also proud to have the second highest Che Kung statue in the world. The highest Che Kung statue is in Taiwan and stands at 23.16m high while the one at the Tian Pao Kong temple in Yong Peng stands at 20.72m.



Love for hockey and athletics keep GOVINDAN going



Hockey and athletics go hand in hand for retired teacher P. Govindan – a familiar figure at stadiums for the two sports.

His last international outings saw him officiate at the 29th Sea Games and the 9th Para Games, both held in the Malaysian capital city of Kuala Lumpur. Govindan was the chief judge for jumps in the 2017 Sea Games and referee for jumps in 2017 Para Games.

As an IAAF Class One Technical Official he also participated as referee or chief judge for field events in the 1977 and 2001 Sea Games and the 1998 Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur.

Govindan, a Kluang resident, next moves to the 7th edition of the Sultan of Johor Cup in Johor Bahru where the world acclaimed junior invitational Under-21 meet will be held at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium from Oct 22-29.

Just like many others Govindan



has been a “victim of sports politics” and was left out of many international meets, both in hockey and athletics. But the 70-year-old has taken all in his stride and is still “serving faithfully” his two loves.

His teaching career saw him criss-cross the state to serve the education ministry. His teaching stints included Muar, Kluang, Rengam, Mengkibol, Mersing and Ulu Belitong where he retired as a Senior Assistant (Co-Curriculum).

He was beaten by the “teaching bug” after a one year stint as a temporary teacher at Sekolah Tengku Mahmud 2 under P.J. Danker, a former well known football personality in Johor football.

Govindan is a graduate from the Malaysian Teachers College (now known as Institut Pendidikan Guru) in Johor Bahru in 1969. His first posting was in Muar. While in college he took up hockey and hockey umpiring – which started his hockey journey.

Highlights of his hockey career saw Govindan hold the Kluang District Hockey Association post of treasurer for 25 years. Currently he is the Kluang Amateur Athletics Association (AAA) treasurer for 25 years.



As a Johor Hockey Association (JHA) council member Govindan served under three former presidents – former Chief Minister Haji Othman Saat, the late Dato Suleiman Mohd Noor and Tengku Abdul Majid Sultan Iskandar.

On the athletics front Govindan qualified as a MAAU (Malaysian Amateur Athletics Union (now known as Malaysia Athletics Federation) technical official for field events in 1975. He is also qualified in Paralympics and has officiated in local and international meets in Malaysia.

Govindan attended the Hockey Technical Officials course in August 1994 which was conducted by Peter M Crane in Penang. He now serves Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) as a judge or technical official for junior and senior hockey leagues and national tournaments.

“My only regret is not being appointed as a judge or a technical official for international hockey tournaments held in the country, especially Johor Bahru where junior officials were roped in.

“But it will not stop me from serving hockey and athletics as long as my service is needed,” says the widely travelled Govindan who has travelled to Europe, Australia, New Zealand, India, Thailand, Myanmar, Vietnam, Cambodia, China, Japan, Hong Kong.

He was also the team manager for the Hong Kong Marathon in 2013.



BALBIR – a non-smoker and non-drinker, devoted to kids development programmes

Hockey is in his blood and even at the age of 72, former international Balbir Singh is devoted to the stick and ball game – with development programmes for the kids.

The father of three – a non-smoker and non-drinker - is rather concerned with the current trend of unhealthy activities and wants to impart his hockey knowledge and expertise with a two-fold mission.

In wanting to develop hockey at grassroots, Balbir also wants to keep kids away from the streets and possible human trafficking.

Staying in Taman Rasa Jaya in Seremban, Negri Sembilan, the former Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB) employee, even shuttles between his home and Kuala Lumpur for development programmes with kids.

Among his ongoing development programmes in Seremban are:

- 1) MPS Under-12 Kids Development Programme
- 2) Negeri Sembilan Sikhs Under-12 Kids Development Programmes.

The former international holds a Level Three Coaching Certificate; Level One Sports Science Certificate and National Coaching Accreditation Programme (Singapore).

A stickler for discipline, Balbir donned national



colours from 1973-1974 and played in the Singapore Sea Games (1973) and several other international tournaments.

Balbir was the assistant coach of the national senior team from 1989-1991. During his stint with the national juniors as assistant coach (1987-1989), Malaysia finished sixth in the Junior World Cup.

In 1997 Balbir was the chief coach of the Thailand men's and women's hockey teams in the Jakarta Sea Games.

From 1986-1988 Balbir was the chief coach of the Johor Razak Cup and Johor Under-20 teams. During the same period Balbir was head coach of TNB in the National Hockey League and inter-state government services.

In the 90s Balbir had several stints in Singapore and among them as chief coach of Singapore Recreation Club and chief coach of Raffles Institution – leading his teams to several championship titles in the republic.

As a veteran Balbir played for Malaysia in the International Grandmasters Hockey Tournament in Germany in 2006 and the Asian International Senior Grandmasters in Singapore (2011).

Australia turned on the heat to beat Pakistan 3-1 in the final for their first Sultan of Johor Cup Under-21 Invitational tournament title after five attempts.

Apart from winning the title the Burras also walked away with the Man of the Match through Kiran Arunasalam. On a glorious night Australia also won the Top Scorer's award through Tom Craig with six goals.

Japan defeated England 4-1 in a penalty shootout to finish third in their first Sultan of Johor Cup. Regulation

time ended in a 2-2 draw. There was more to come from Japan when the team from the Land of the Rising Sun took home the Fair Play award while Keita Matsuda was voted the Best Goalkeeper in the six-nation tournament.

Australia's previous best in the Sultan of Johor Cup was runners-up in the inaugural tournament in 2011. The following year Australia finished third and skipped the tournament in 2013 before making a return in 2014 (third place) and were fifth last year.

Pakistan led 1-0 after six minutes through a penalty corner goal by Hassan Tazeem-Ul but Australia made it all square through Frazer Gerrard from a penalty corner on 13 minutes.

Rio Olympian Blake Govers then gave Australia the lead off a penalty stroke before completing his brace in the 67th minute from a penalty corner.

His Majesty Sultan Ibrahim Sultan Iskandar the Sultan of Johor gave away the prizes to the champions.

The Australians won the Sultan of Johor Cup for the first time last year – defeating Pakistan 3-1 in the final.

However, it was a come from behind win for the Aussies who had beaten Pakistan by a whopping 8-1 margin in the round robin match and started the title match as favourites.

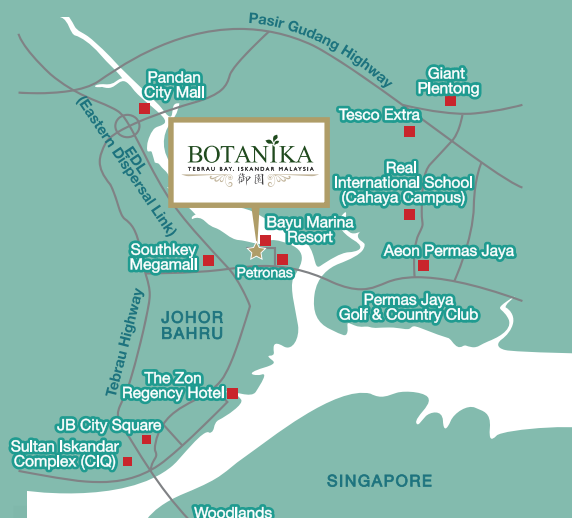
