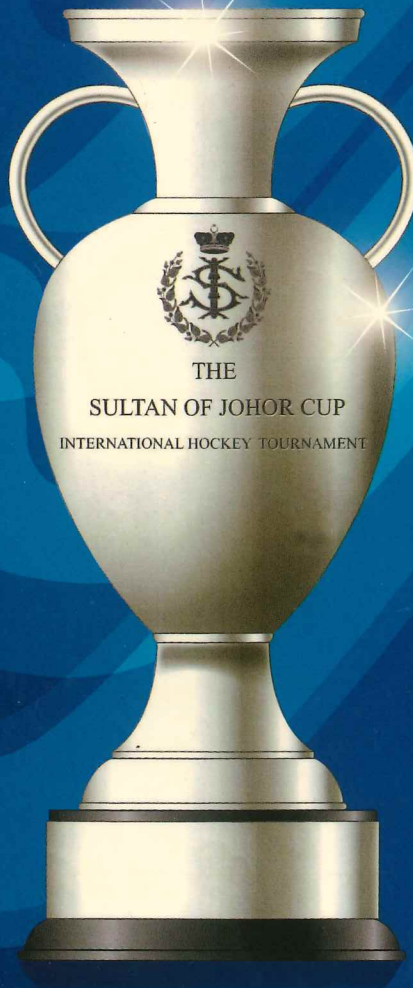

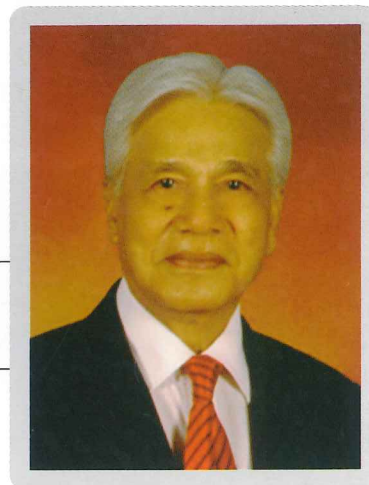

To all participants, I wish you well in the competition, and may you have pleasant memories from this tournament.

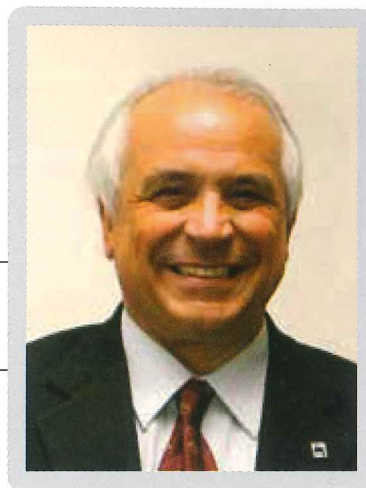

SULTAN IBRAHIM, THE SPORTS-LOVING PEOPLE'S RULER OF JOHOR

JOHOR ruler Duli Yang Maha Mulia Sultan Ibrahim Ismail ibni Sultan Iskandar, Sultan and Ruler of the State and Dependencies of Johor Darul Ta'zim, was born on 22 Nov 1958 at Sultanah Aminah Hospital in Johor Bahru.

Sultan Ibrahim was installed as the 25th Sultan of Johor on 23 January 2010 following the demise of his father Sultan Iskandar Al-Haj ibni Almarhum Sultan Sir Ismail Al-Khalidi.

The 53-year-old Sultan Ibrahim is married to Raja Zarith Sofia, daughter the late Sultan Idris Shah II of Perak in 1982. The couple has six children: Tunku Ismail Idris (who is also the Crown Prince of Johor), Tunku Aminah Maimunah Iskandariah, Tunku Idris, Tunku Abdul Jalil, Tunku Abdul Rahman and Tunku Abu Bakar.

The sports-loving ruler is a keen sportsman excelling in polo which has taken him to international competitions. His Royal Highness is also a tennis player, windsurfer, shooter and motoring enthusiast.

Sultan Ibrahim is well-known as the founder of the annual popular motorcycling tour event, Kembara Mahkota Johor. Known as the "People's Ruler", Sultan Ibrahim, puts protocol aside during the Kembara Mahkota Tour to mingle with his subjects in the state, especially in the outlying districts and take part in activities, including fast disappearing traditional games, with them.

Sultan Ibrahim received his religious education at Sekolah Agama Bukit Zaharah and Sekolah Agama Air Molek in Johor Bahru. After completing his secondary education he was sent to the army training centre (Pulada) in Kota Tinggi where he received basic

military training for three months. He was later sent to Fort Benning, Georgia and Fort Bragg, North Carolina, both in the United States of America, to acquire more military knowledge.

On his return to Malaysia Sultan Ibrahim was appointed the deputy commander of the Johor Military Force. He also attended helicopter training at the Kluang military base where he earned his wings apart from attending a two-month training stint with the Royal Malaysian Navy.

In his own words, Sultan Ibrahim, says he is "never a boring person" when he posted on the Straits Times Blogs on July 1, 2011 after driving the last train out of Tanjong Pagar Railway Station in Singapore after it was officially closed on June 30 2011.

"What the governments do has got nothing to do with me. To me, it is sentimental matter. It was my great grandfather, the late Sultan Ibrahim, who opened the Causeway, designed for both road and rail links. He paved the way, literally, for the first train to rumble into Singapore from Malaysia back in 1923.

"I felt it was only appropriate for me, as the ruler of Johor, to drive the last train out," wrote Sultan Ibrahim, who besides driving trains, flies jets, helicopters and sails his own yacht.

Sultan Ibrahim is also the first royalty in Malaysia to receive his locomotive driving licence and has driven trains to places like Seremban, Kluang and Kuala Lumpur. But when he drove the last train out of Singapore it was the first time that he set foot into Tanjong Pagar Railway Station.



WORLD CLASS TAMAN DAYA HOCKEY STADIUM IS JOHOR BAHRU'S PRIDE



THE Taman Daya Hockey Stadium built at a cost of RM21 million for the Junior World Cup Finals in 2009 is the pride of Johor Bahru, a bustling metropolitan city whose skyline is undergoing massive changes due to the rapid development under Iskandar Malaysia.



The stadium received all round praise from teams that played in the Junior World Cup Finals for its excellent facilities. The world class main competition pitch was built at a cost of RM16 million and can accommodate 5,000 spectators while the adjacent practice pitch has a seating capacity of 3,000.



Both the pitches are laid in MegaTurf, produced by German turf manufacturer Polytan – a well known brand in the world of hockey.

Come this November, the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium will again come under focus when it hosts another world class tournament - the inaugural Sultan of Johor Cup, which is held in conjunction with the Johor ruler's birthday celebrations and will be an annual affair and is sanctioned by the International Hockey Federation (FIH).

The Sultan of Johor Cup is an international invitational Under-21 tournament that will feature six teams – New Zealand, Australia, South Korea, India, Pakistan and Malaysia.



JOHOR

A Precious Jewel at the Southern Tip of Mainland Asia

THE origins of the name Johor comes from the Arabic word 'JAUHAR' which means 'precious jewel' and reflects the Arabic influence in the state which is hailed as the Southern-most Tip of Mainland Asia.

It is the third largest state in the country and can be described as a holiday playground for excitement, adventure and nature. Johor has numerous beautiful off-shore islands, most of them noted for their clean beaches and coral reefs that are best visited during the months of May to October when visibility is at its best.

Johor is fortunate to be blessed with a wide spectrum of unparalleled tourist attractions. Apart from the enchanting islands and beautiful sandy beaches, Johor also offers tropical rainforests, invigorating waterfalls and even natural phenomenon in the form of fireflies.

It does not stop at that as Johor is also a golfer's paradise and a shopping haven which offers everything for a bargain. For history lovers, walk into a time zone heritage with the majestic Sultan Ibrahim Building as a landmark.

To appreciate the rich and diverse culture of Johor, you have to look into the customs and traditions, lifestyle and beliefs of its people – the past of course influenced and shared the culture of today.

Though each race has its own festival, the people of Johor and Malaysia respect and celebrate them together in the true spirit of muhibbah, which means racial assimilation. The main festivals are Hari Raya Aidilfitri, Chinese New Year, Deepavali, Vasakhi and Christmas.

Among the traditional Malay music is Ghazal. It was believed that Ghazal was introduced by the Indian Armed Forces around the 1920s. It is played with several musical instruments, including the harmonium, violin, gambus, guitar, tabla and maracas.

When it comes to dances, Kuda Kepang and Zapin are among the more popular traditional Malay dances in Johor. Kuda Kepang is a term used to symbolise horse-riding ritual. The dance was believed to have come from Java for the propagation of Islam in the 15th century by re-enacting the courage of Islamic warriors. Described as "dramatic and hypnotic", Kuda Kepang is today developed as a traditional dance to promote the cultural heritage of Johor.

Zapin, generally believed to have originated from Arab, is a beautiful and graceful traditional Malay dance and is very popular in Johor. The dance is often performed in groups in sequential and orderly movements that are associated with birds. It has become a major attraction at official functions as well as fiesta, wedding receptions and other ceremonies.

Johor is a land of multiple attractions, judging by the diversity of its tourist attractions, including recreational forests, some of which have been declared as national parks – namely the Endau Rompin National Park, Gunung Ledang Legendary Park, and Tanjung Piai & Pulau Kukup National Parks.



A monument in Tanjung Piai has been built to mark the site as the southernmost tip of Mainland Asia. A 300m boardwalk allows visitors to reach out the sea and to enjoy the feeling of being at the world landmark. A resort, with accommodation facilities, serves fresh seafood and organises fishing activities and trips.

The Recreational Forests in Johor include the Sungai Bantang Recreational Forest (Segamat), Gunung Lambak Recreational Forest (Kluang), Gunung Ledang Recreational Forest (Ledang), Gunung Arong Recreational Forest (Mersing), Gunung Belumut Recreational Forest (Kluang), and Panti Recreational Forest (Kota Tinggi).

Johor's most famous beach resort is Desaru. This internationally known beach lies along the east coast in the district of Kota Tinggi and has a stretch of 26km of pristine, sandy beach, fringed with casuarinas or palms. The name "Desaru" means a village of casuarinas as Desa means village while Ru is the local name for Casuarina.

Johor was founded in the early 16th century by the son of Sultan Mahmud Shah, the last Sultan of Malacca (Melaka) when the Portuguese conquered his state. At its peak, the Johor Empire stretched to the Riau Archipelago. In the 18th century, the Bugis of Celebes and the Minangkabaus of Sumatra controlled the political powers in the Johor-Riau Empire in the 19th century, Malay and Bugis rivalry dominated the scene.

The history of modern Johor began under the reign of Sultan Abu Bakar. His Royal Highness was crowned Sultan in 1866 and introduced the Johor Constitution, which brought changes in the administration of Johor, making it more efficient.

The relocation of the central administration of Johor from Teluk Belanga to Tanjung Puteri in 1841 had positive outcomes for Johor, especially in terms of development. Construction of government buildings, police stations, mosques, courts and royal palace clearly indicates that Sultan Abu Bakar is worthy of the title 'Johor's Father of Development'.

He was succeeded by his son Sultan Ibrahim. In 1914, the British appointed a British Adviser to administer Johor until the Japanese Occupation in 1945. In 1957, Johor joined the Federation of Malaya.

Johor is the first state to have its own armed forces, and the only army that is financed by the state government. They are still in existence, and are known as Askar Timbalan Setia Negeri Johor (Johor Military Force (JMF)). JMF is an armed unit under the rule of the Sultan of Johor.

Nowadays, Johor borders Malacca, Pahang and Singapore and Johor is also one of the most developed and advancing states in Malaysia. Under the fast and furious investment and infrastructure



developments that are altering the region, Johor Bahru's traffic system will see a 15km highway that stretches the city CBD and passing through Danga Bay and on to Nusajaya, cutting travel time significantly and is nearing completion.

Johor's economy is based on a mix of agriculture, manufacturing, commerce and tourism. The major agricultural commodities are rubber, palm oil, pepper and pineapple. The state also has three major international ports – Johor Port and Tanjung Langsat, both in Pasir Gudang, and Port of Tanjung Pelepas in Nusajaya.

Tanjung Langsat, the state's third harbour built on a 750-acre site with a 4.5km shoreline, it has a special focus on petrochemicals and liquefied petroleum gas (LPG). Tanjung Langsat is also the venue for the Tanjung Langsat Industrial Complex, where light, medium and heavy industries are concentrated on a 4200-acre-site.

The Pasir Gudang Industrial Park, which is home to more than 300 companies, has solid access to Johor Bahru via a four-lane highway and a railway line. Under the fast and furious investment and infrastructure developments that are altering the region under Iskandar Malaysia, Johor is headed for major economic boom. Pasir Gudang also has the world's largest edible oil tankage facility.

A large number of catalytic and infrastructure projects are expected to be completed by next year and this includes the Senai Airport renovations. The facility at the Senai Airport is a major expansion programme, with the long-term aim of making it a rival to Singapore's Changi Airport, which is described as one of the busiest in the world.

Johor's new administrative capital is Kota Iskandar, which has become a new tourist attraction in Nusajaya.





THE SULTAN OF JOHOR CUP 2011 Launched At A Glittering Ceremony

Two years after witnessing the best hockey talent in the world compete in the Junior World Cup Finals in 2009, hockey buffs are in for another treat of top class hockey when the inaugural Sultan of Johor Cup is held in November.

The world's first ever Under-21 invitational tournament will be held from 5 to 12 November 2011 at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium – the very venue that hosted the Junior World Cup Finals – and will see six teams competing for the Sultan of Johor Cup.

The Taman Daya Hockey Stadium, built at a cost of RM16 million, has world class facilities with MegaTurf pitches produced by German turf manufacturer Polytan. The main stadium can accommodate 5,000 spectators while the adjacent practice pitch has a seating for 3,000.

Australia, New Zealand, South Korea, India, Pakistan and hosts Malaysia will take part in the weeklong tournament. The International Hockey Federation (FIH) has given its blessings and sanctioned the tournament that will also feature on its international hockey calendar.

The Sultan of Johor Cup was officially launched at a glittering ceremony by Johor's sports loving ruler His Royal Highness Sultan Ibrahim Almarhum Sultan Iskandar at the Johor International Convention Centre (Persada) in Johor Bahru on September 28.

Also present at the ceremony was the Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) president HRH Prince Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah, Johor Chief Minister Datuk Abdul Ghani Othman, Johor Hockey Association president YB Mohd Jais Sarday, who is also the State Executive Councilor for Youth and Sports and the organising committee chairman of Sultan of Johor Cup.





MHC deputy president Datuk Nur Azmi Ahmad, general manager-cum-secretary general Maninderjit Singh, MHF vice-president Majid Manjit Abdullah, who is also the Johor Hockey Association deputy president, MHC Honorary treasurer Datuk Anuarul Aini Perai, and a host of other officials were among others present.

The presence of corporate big guns like Kamaruzzaman Mohd Kassim, (JCorp), Datuk Shahir Nasir (SAJ Holdings Sdn Bhd), Datuk Jaafar Mohamad (Century Logistics Holdings), Datuk Chan Tien Ghee (Central Malaysian Properties) and the Johor state cabinet, senior state government officials, including state secretary Datuk Obet Tawil, added colour to the ceremony which ended with a lavish luncheon while the guests were entertained by the Johor Military Force band.

Apart from the Junior World Cup, the Sultan of Johor Cup is the perfect platform to expose, unearth and launch new talent and captivate fans. The Sultan of Johor Cup will undoubtedly serve Malaysian hockey well as a foundation to nurture and motivate young prospects. This tournament also provides much needed competitive sparring for the teams who will play in the 2013 Junior World Cup qualifiers next year and the Junior Asia Cup in Malacca next May.

Prince Abdullah said Malaysia is fortunate to have "sports loving rulers who have actively contributed to growth and development of hockey in the nation" and this augurs well for the sport in the country.

"The Sultan of Johor Cup is the perfect platform to expose, unearth and launch new talent," he said at the launch.

"We also call on the sponsors to provide support for the event and to help project the wonders of the national and Johor to the world."

Fittingly, the tournament, co-hosted by the Johor State Government, Johor Hockey Association and MHC, raised RM1.25 million from various sponsors. The Johor Government led the sponsorship contribution with RM500,000 while Genting Berhad, Johor Corporation, the Zon Johor Bahru, Danga Bay and Century Logistics Holdings were the other major sponsors.

Malaysia's opening match in the tournament is against Australia at 8pm. South Korea will take on India in the opener at 4pm before New Zealand square up against Pakistan at 6pm.

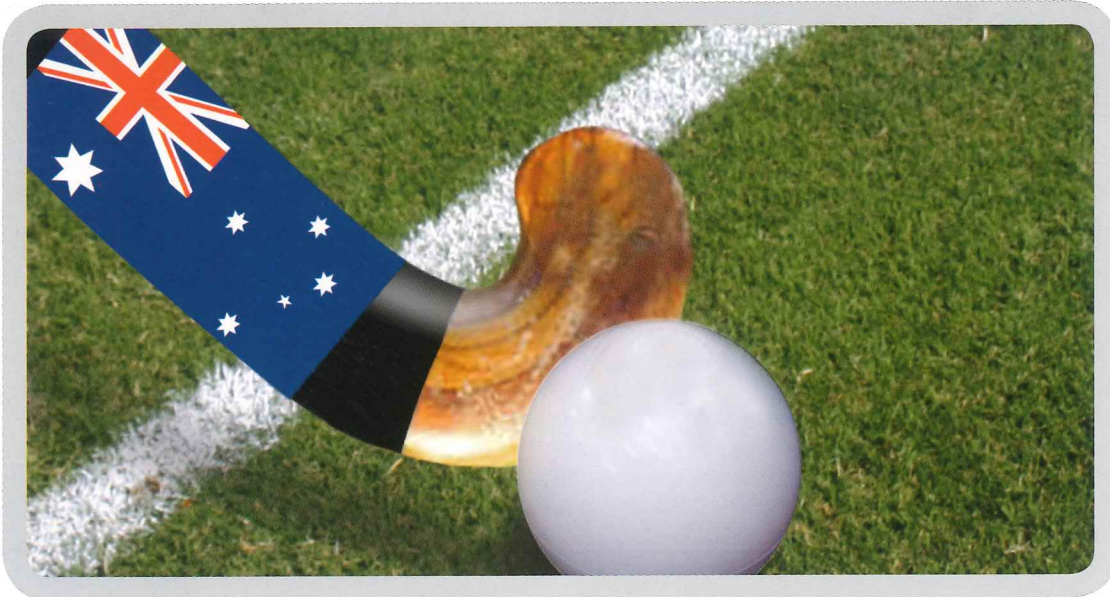
