

The Sultan of Johor Cup has elevated the region as an international hockey destination as it is an annual tournament that brings some of the best young hockey talent from around the world.



AMARJIT - FIH'S TRUST, MALAYSIA'S PRIDE

It is a great honour not only for me but to the country as well for having been given the trust...

- First Umpires Manager to do 5 international meets in a year – a record of sorts

After an illustrious career as an international umpire Amarjit Singh Jessy has done Malaysia proud again in the hockey world.

The 48-year-old Amarjit, a bank officer with CIMB in Ipoh, has become the first in the world to be bestowed a rare honour by the International Hockey Federation (FIH) as umpires manager for five international tournaments in a year.

It is a first in the history of FIH to bestow such honour on an individual and Malaysia takes pride in Amarjit's achievements in his career as an umpires' manager.

His colourful hockey career as an umpire has seen him through four Senior World Cups – in Ultretch, Holland (1998); Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (2002); Munchengladbach, Germany (2006) and New Delhi, India (2010).

He also officiated at three Olympics – Sydney, Australia (2000); Athens, Greece (2004) and Beijing, China (2008) apart from two Champions Trophy and two Commonwealth Games.

Amarjit also takes pride in having umpired the Junior World Cup final between Australia and Argentina in Rotterdam, Holland in 2005.

The figures are impressive and speak volumes of his success as an umpire.

Amarjit's role as umpires' manager has also caught the eye of FIH. But the year 2013 stands out in Amarjit's career as umpires' manager.

Amarjit has his hands full this year. His year round assignments started with the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup in Ipoh in March. This was followed by the World League Semi-Final (Round 3) in Johor Baru in June -July.

Amarjit's next assignment was the Asia Cup in Ipoh in August followed by the 3rd edition of the Sultan of Johor Cup in Johor Baru. The finale is the Junior World Cup in New Delhi in December.

All the six teams – Argentina, England, India, Pakistan, Korea and Malaysia - competing in the Sultan of Johor Cup will also be playing in the World Cup.

Amarjit's hockey career started way back in the 90s when he represented the National 'B' team in 1992. He then switched to umpiring and has never looked back with the whistle since then.

For the record, Amarjit umpired154 international matches during his umpiring career. He is the first Asian umpire and currently the only Malaysian to have received the FIH Golden Whistle – awarded to an individual who reaches the century mark.

Amarjit's achievements are all the more remarkable, considering the fact that he is not a member of any committee in the Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC), the Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) and the FIH at present.





He is the former chairman of the MHF Umpiring Committee (2008-2010) and has conducted umpires courses in Myanmar, Thailand, China, Indonesia and Asian Umpires Academy.

Amarjit was also one of the final 10 shortlisted for the London Olympics as Umpires Manager.

Among the other tournaments as umpires' manager were the Azlan Shah Cup (2010, 2011, 2012, 2013); Champions Challenge 2 in Lille, France (2011): Champions Challenge in Argentina (2012); Olympic Qualifiers in Japan (2012); Chinese National League, Beijing (2012).

"It is a great honour not only for me but to the country as well for having been given the trust as the umpires' manager for so many tournaments.

"As there are many major international meets next year, these tournaments are the stepping stone for the bigger league," said Amarjit, who is also the umpires coach.

Richard Wilson, who is FIH's Officials Manager had this to say: "In general a umpires' manager will get one or two appointments per year."

Amarjit is FIH's trust and Malaysia's pride.





BOOST for SULTAN OF JOHOR CUP 2013

Once again the Johor State Government showed its commitment in making Johor a major sporting hub in this region when it led the sponsorship with a contribution of RM500,000 at the official launch of the 3rd edition of the Sultan of Johor Cup.

And it was a surprise when the Sultan of Johor made a personal contribution of RM200,000 for this year's tournament.

A total of RM1.5 million was raised during the official launch for the Under-21 Invitational hockey tournament in Johor Baru from September 22-29, with promises of more funds in the pipeline from other sponsors.

This year's edition will see Argentina

and England making their debut in the FIH sanctioned tournament and features in the FIH calendar.

The Sultan of Johor Cup is the only junior international tournament that is held annually. The only other junior hockey tournament that features in the FIH calendar is the Junior World Cup which is held once every four years.

Inaugurated in 2011, the Sultan of Johor Cup has drawn much interest among the hockey playing nations around the world. The other teams competing in this year's meet, are regulars India and Pakistan and Korea who are making a return after a year's absence with hosts Malaysia completing the list.

It is interesting to note that all the six teams will be playing in this year's Junior World Cup Finals in New Delhi in December.

Organising secretary and Johor Hockey Association deputy president (I) Manjit Abdullah this year's tournament has drawn the best teams as the Sultan of Johor Cup is the last tournament before the Junior World Cup Finals.

"I expect most of the competing teams to finalise their world cup squad after this tournament. With Argentina and England making their debut it will give the tournament a keener edge," said Manjit Abdullah, who is also a vice-president of the Malaysian Hockey Confederation.

Johor Corporation (JCorp), the state government's investment arm, the Ministry of Youth and Sports, the National Sports Council (NSC),The Zon, Khazanah Malaysia Berhad, UM Land and TNB pledged RM100,000 each.

Syarikat Air Johor (SAJ), Genting Malaysia Berhad, Iskandar Waterfront, Astro Arena pledged RM50,000 each and BCB Berhad (RM20,000), UEM Land Sdn Bhd (RM10,000) while F & N Beverages (100PLUS), Modenas and Chili's will sponsor in kind.

The sponsors presented their contributions to Sultan Ibrahim Sultan Iskandar the ruler of Johor





in a glittering ceremony held at the Puteri Pacific Hotel, which is also the official hotel for the tournament, on August 29.

Among the host of dignitaries present at the ceremony, apart from Sultan Ibrahim, were Johor Chief Minister Dato' Seri Khaled Nordin, Johor State Secretary Datuk Obet Tawil, Johor State Executive Councillor for Youth and Sports Datuk Zulkurnain Kamisan, Manjit, JHA deputy president (II) Amran Abdul Rahman, who is the District Officer of Johor Bahru, Johor Sports Council director Ramli Abdul Rahman and Datuk Shahir Nasir (SAJ Holdings Sdn Bhd).

As it has been the norm after each launch, the dignitaries, guests and sponsors were treated to a lavish luncheon while being entertained by the Johor Military Force band.

Defending champions Germany are the notable absentees this year. Also missing are Australia, who competed in the first two editions. It could have been a seven team affair this year but South Africa pulled out due to financial constraints.

Malaysia became the first holders of the Sultan of Johor Cup, beating Australia 3-2 in the final while Germany edged India 3-2 for the title last year.

Ode to Late Olympian CHUA BOON HUAT

CHUA BOON HUAT'S UNTIMELY DEATH LEAVES A VACUUM

MALAYSIAN hockey was shocked by the tragic and untimely death of hockey stalwart Chua Boon Huat, 33, who died in a car on the Damansara-Puchong at 2.55am on August 1. Until his death the Malacca-born Boon Huat was Malaysia's most capped player with 337 caps which is a Malaysian record. Boon Huat was returning home when his Proton Perdana crashed into a tanker which was watering the plants along the highway.

The ever smiling Boon Huat died just hours after receiving duit raya from Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) president HRH Prince Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah at a hotel in Kuala Lumpur.

At the same function Boon Huat and the rest of the players broke fast with the Pahang Crown Prince who handed out incentives to national players.

The quiet and unassuming Boon Huat left the nation grieving. He first made his international debut at the tender age of 17 when he played for the country in the 1998 Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur where Malaysia won a silver medal.

Boon Huat hailed from Malacca and was scheduled to tie the knot with his girlfriend Louise next year. Prince Abdullah said Boon Huat was a "dedicated and committed player" who was a backbone of the team. "More importantly he was a role model for the young and up-coming players. He was a legend."

Youth and Sports Minister Khairy Jamaluddin Abu Bakar described him as an "outstanding player who was an inspiration to others" and said it left a vacuum in the national hockey team.

National hockey coach Paul Revington said Malaysia lost a "warrior who had immense aura" in the team.

National Sports Council director Datuk Zolkples Embong said Boon Huat's absence will be felt at all levels in all sports. "He was not only a role model and inspiration but was disciplined."

Boon Huat was also the skipper of the national junior team in the 2001 World Cup in Hobart, Tasmania. He also played for the senior team in the World Cup, Olympics, Champions Trophy, Asian Games, Asia Cup, Champions Challenge I and II' and the SEA Games apart from the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup.

His last tournament was the eight-team World League Semi-Final, which also served as World Cup Qualifier, held in Johor Bahru from 29 June to 7 July 2013 where Malaysia finished fifth. Malaysia later qualified for next year's World Cup to be held in The Hague, Netherlands.





The Taman Daya Hockey Stadium turned out to be a happy hunting ground for reigning Junior World Cup champions Germany after their 3-2 victory over India in last year's Sultan of Johor Cup final.



In 2009, Germany clinched their fifth Junior World Cup title at the same venue with a 3-1 win over Holland in the final.

For the record Malaysia also seems to be Germany's 'Lucky Charm' as three of their World Cup titles were won in Malaysia since the tournament was inaugurated in 1979.

Apart from the 2009 title in Johor Bahru, Germany also won the world title in Kuala Lumpur (1982) and Ipoh (1989). The Germans also won the World Cup in Vancouver, Canada (1985) and in Terrassa, Spain (1993).

Germany made their Sultan of Johor Cup debut last year

and coming into the annual tournament as five-time Junior World Cup champions made them early favourites based on their strong credentials.

However, Germany took time to settle down to the hot and humid weather conditions but soon made their mark as the tournament progressed.

The Germany-India final was a thriller. The Indians, who will be hosting this year's Junior World Cup Finals in New Delhi in December, were rather unfortunate to lose, hitting the post twice.

India coach Baljeet Singh Saini, a former Olympian, despite the defeat, was nevertheless pleased with the way his team played. "We hit the post twice and that decided the outcome."

German coach Jamilon Muelders praised his defenders for keeping the Indians at bay.

Winning the Sultan of Johor Cup was especially sweet for Muelders. It was his last assignment as the coach of Germany's junior team before taking over as the head coach of the women's team.

Germany scored their goals through Jonas Gumoll, Joshua Delarbar and Florian Adrians. India replied through Satbir Singh and Akashdeep Singh.

Germany will not be competing in this year's Sultan of Johor Cup. However, Argentina and England wll make their debut in the eight-day tournament from Sept 22-29. The other teams invited this year are regulars India and Pakistan and South Korea who skipped the tournament last year. Malaysia, as host, complete the scenario for the six-team field.

Johor Hockey Association deputy president (I) Manjit Majid Abdullah said there is a strong possibility that there could be seven teams in next year's Sultan of Johor Cup.

It was seven teams originally this year but South Africa withdrew at the last minute due to financial constraints.



MALAYSIA'S 2018 WORLD CUP BID TAKES OFF



MALAYSIA'S hospitality and organisational abilities described as "second to none" in the world gives the country the edge of being picked to host 2018 the men's hockey World Cup.

However, Malaysia will have to stave off strong bids from three other countries – India, Australia and New Zealand.

Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) vice-president Manjit Majid Abdullah was in Lausanne, Switzerland to personally submit Malaysia's bid to the International Hockey Federation (FIH) on August 21.

Manjit, who submitted Malaysia's bid to International Hockey Federation (FIH) Chief Executive Officer Kelly Fairweather at the FIH Headquarters, believes Malaysia have the advantage over their rivals.

"We are confident of getting the job although India, Australia and New Zealand are also making strong bids to be host. There are many factors that favour us. Our organisational capabilities have been proven in the past and we also have the facilities to host major international meets," said Manjit.

Malaysia will only know if they are successful in their bid on November 7 when the FIH Executive meets in Lausanne.

If Malaysia succeed in their bid it will only be the third time that Malaysia will get to host the men's World Cup. The first was in 1975 when Malaysia achieved their best ever achievement in the world meet with a fourth placing. The second time Malaysia hosted the World Cup was in 2002.

According to Fairweather all four countries have put extremely strong cases forward in an attempt to lure the sport's top properties to their territory.

The next phase of the process will feature the detailed evaluation of each bid which will be followed by further discussions and clarifications with the national associations of the respective bidders as well as site visits to the country.

He said the final decision will rest with the FIH Executive Board and the winning bid will be announced on 7 November 2013.


Both the Men's and Women's Hockey World Cups 2018 will feature an increased 16-nation field of participants. Next year's World Cup in The Hague will see 12 men's and women's teams compete.

In fact the Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) has already identified three venues for the World Cup. The proposed venues are the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru, the National Hockey Stadium in Bukit Jalil and the Kuantan Hockey Stadium.

The Taman Daya Hockey Stadium was the venue for the 2009 Junior World Cup Finals jointly hosted with Singapore and the World League Semi-Final (Round 3) in July this year.

The annual Sultan of Johor Cup Under-21 Invitational tournament is also held at the same venue.






JOHOR A PARADISE FOR BIRD WATCHING
















Sandy beaches and blue seas come to mind when



Johor, which is hailed as the southernmost tip of mainland Asia, has it all, making it a popular destination to both local and foreign tourists.



Orginating from the Arabic word 'Jauhar' which means 'precious jewel' the southern state of Malaysia, covering 19,984 sq km, boasts one of the finest assemblages of tropical lowland birds which can be found at the Panti Bird Sanctuary.

Records show that more than 300 of the nearly 700 species of birds known from Peninsular Malaysia have been recorded in the forests of Panti and this represents more than forty percent of the country's total.


Dubbed as a "gift" from the Johor State Government and the Johor State Forestry Department to all nature lovers, the Panti Bird Sanctuary is carved out of the Forestry Compartments 36, 38, 40, 44, 54, 55, 56, 57 and 58.

The allocation of 1,200ha has been translated into something that not only benefits nature lovers but has given a big boost to eco-tourism and avi-tourism as this important bird area is conserved.

With eco-tourism and avi-tourism identified as a lucrative niche market, the Iskandar Regional Development Authority (IRDA) embarked on a massive programme to train nature guides and birding guides.







Johor is known for its national parks and rich virgin rainforests, mangrove swamps and coral reefs – all protected to keep nature intact and to further develop its tourism market.

The most famous of the national parks in Johor is the Endau Rompin National Park. The others are the Gunung Ledang Legendary National Park, Tanjung Piai National Park and the Mersing Marine Park.

A monument built in Tanjung Piai marks the site as the southernmost tip of mainland Asia. A 300m boardwalk allows visitors to reach out to the sea and to enjoy the feeling of being at the world landmark.

At Tanjung Piai, there is a resort with accommodation facilities that serves fresh seafood and organises fishing activities and trips for tourists.

The Recreational Forests in Johor include the Sungai Bantang Recreational Forest (Segamat), Gunung Lambak Recreational Forest (Kluang), Gunung Ledang Recreational Forest (Ledang), Gunung Recreational Arong (Mersing), Forest Gununa Recreational Belumut Forest (Kluang) and Panti Recreational Forest (Kota Tinggi).

There is also the Sungai Sedili Besar and Sungai Sedili Kecil Wetland Preservation and Sungai Lebam Wetland Preservation.

The "jewels" found in the state of Johor have become a paradise for bird watchers all year round, especially when migratory birds from the northern hemisphere make their journey to Johor.

The Panti Bird Sanctuary is not only an oasis of bird diversity but also identified as the "Gateway to the Tropical Forest of Peninsular Malaysia" that is rich in biodiversity, giving the eco-tourist a treat that is second to none.

Putting the Panti Bird Sanctuary aside, early this year about 150 Asian Openbill storks were seen frolicking at a padi field in Teluk Rimba in Muar.

Johor has become a well known tourist destination both locally and also among the foreigners – thanks to the aggressive promotion by the Johor Tourism Council.

The bustling city of Johor Bahru draws the top hockey playing nations to the annual Sultan of Johor Cup Invitational Under-21 tournament — the world's only Under-21 meet apart from the Junior World Cup which is held every four years.

The Sultan of Johor Cup was inaugurated in 2011 and is a sixnation tournament which features on the International Hockey Federation (FIH) calendar.

This year Argentina and England will make their debut. The other teams are India, Pakistan, South Korea and Malaysia. All six teams will play in the Junior World Cup Finals which will be held in New Delhi, India in December.

When it comes to golf Johor Bahru is a popular destination among the world's top golfers for the Iskandar Johor Open, which is sanctioned by the Asian Tour.





Korea's dramatic 4-3 win over India in the men's Asia Cup final in Ipoh saw Malaysia through to the 2014 World Cup in The Hague, Netherlands, slotted to be held from 31st May to 15th June next year.

Malaysia's date in The Hague was guaranteed as like all continental championships, the South Koreans as Asia Cup champions were given a direct World Cup qualification.

With Korea, having been promoted from first reserves to confirmed World Cup qualifiers, and thanks to Argentina's victory in the Pan American Cup,

the door was opened to the other reserves for the summer tournament.

Second reserves Spain were confirmed for the event courtesy of Germany's success in the Euro Hockey Championships. This meant that Malaysia, as the third reserves became the team to benefit from Korea's Asia Cup victory.

In the process, Malaysia became the 10th men's team to qualify for next year's World Cup. Two more places are up for grab at the upcoming continental championships in Oceania and Africa.

*Netherlands finished third in the Hockey World League Semi-Final in Rotterdam. As they are already pre-qualified as the host, this means that the highest ranked fourth place finisher from both Semi-Final events earns direct qualification to the World Cup. This place goes to New Zealand, who were fourth in Rotterdam and currently sit fifth in the FIH World Rankings.

**Spain qualified as second reserve courtesy of Germany's victory in the Euro Hockey Championships. Spain (5th in Rotterdam) were named the second reserve ahead of Malaysia (5th in Johor Bahru) courtesy of a superior placing in the FIH World Rankings.

***Malaysia qualified as third reserve courtesy of Korea's victory in the Asia Cup 2013.

World Cup Qualification - The Next Stage

The remaining places at the World Cup for men will be filled by the winners of the final two continental championships. However, if any of the above listed teams also becomes continental champion it will open the door to the team that finished outside the top three at the Hockey World League Semi-Finals that has not yet qualified for the World Cup. This team is India (6th in Rotterdam / 4th reserve for the World Cup).
