
This is another milestone in the history of the Sultan of Johor Cup. Sports brings nations together and it develops and strengthens friendships and in the process, bonding people in spirited competition.














SULTAN IBRAHIM A DISTINGUISHED LEADER AND RESPECTED MONARCH

MALAYSIAN HOCKEY HISTORY WRITTEN AT SULTAN OF JOHOR CUP IN 2011



Great Britain has been the most successful team in the Sultan of Johor Under21 International Invitational tournament since it was incepted in 2011, winning the title three times and are the defending champions.

However, November 12 that year also holds special memories for Malaysian hockey. It is the day when Malaysian hockey history was written by the young Malaysian team, lifting the trophy at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru with a 3-2 win over Australia after extra time.



In the process, Malaysia had the honour of being the first team to engrave their name on the majestic silverware made of sterling silver.

The RM100,000 trophy was specially crafted and handmade in London. The Sultan of Johor Cup was 'born' - thanks to the keen interest shown by two sporting royalties - Tengku Abdullah (now king of Malaysia) of Pahang and Sultan Ibrahim of Johor.

It was a historic win for Malaysia as it was Malaysia's first ever international hockey title either at home or abroad. Coach K. Dharmaraj described the win as a "great moment for the game in Malaysia."

Skipper Mohamed Noor Faeez scored from a penalty corner in the 75th minute to seal the title. He also forced the match into extra time with a last gasp equaliser in the 69th minute. Fitri Saar scored Malaysia's other goal.

Great Britain won the title in 2015, 2018, 2019. India and Australia have won the title twice each. The Indians were champions in 2013 and 2014, while the Aussies engraved their name in 2016, 2017. Germany is the only other team to have lifted the silverware and this was in 2012 with a 3-2 win over India in the final.

This year, South Africa is making its debut in the tournament which will add colour to the weeklong hockey extravaganza. The other teams are Australia, Great Britain, India, Japan and host Malaysia.

As hosts, Malaysia have featured in all previous editions while Australia and India are next on the list with eight appearances each, followed by Great Britain and New Zealand with seven each and Pakistan on six.



SOJC TO HAVE EIGHT TEAMS NEXT YEAR

The much sought after Sultan of Johor Cup Under-21 Invitational International tournament is back after a two-year hiatus due to the global Covid-19 pandemic which saw the shutting down of industries, travel, and borders and sport also saw similar effects.

This led to almost total shutdown of competitive sport at all levels and the six-nation Sultan of Johor Cup, which celebrates its 10th anniversary this year, had to be cancelled in 2020 and last year.

This year's tournament will remain a six-team affair. However, it will be eight teams next year, vying for the majestic silverware says Johor Hockey Association (JHA) president Dato' Majid Manjit Abdullah.

The change is timely for the SOJC as Malaysia play hosts to next year's Junior World Cup Finals in Kuala Lumpur in December. Apart from hosts Malaysia, the other 15 teams will quality via the continental championships.

According to Manjit, Germany, runners-up at the last

edition of the Junior World Cup held in Bhubaneswar in Odisha, India, have already written to the Malaysian Hockey Confederation (MHC) to be invited for next year's Sultan of Johor Cup.

"We have also scheduled next year's SOJC to be held in October before the Junior World Cup Finals so that teams can use the tournament as their final testing ground before finalising their final World Cup squad," said Manjit.

The Sultan of Johor Cup is the only annual Under-21 (invitational) international tournament and features in the FIH annual calendar. It has become such a hit that year in, year out it has become painful for the organisers to turn down requests. That hurts.

With the increase in teams the format for Sultan of Johor Cup is expected to change from the current round-robin league where the top two teams play in the final while the third and fourth placed teams battle for the third placing playoff. The format will be decided later.

'TARZAN' SELVARAJAH'S

PAIN AND HEARTBREAK IN HOCKEY



He was named as one of the best Malaysian players by Pakistani legend Rashid Junior, and even then the country's hockey head honcho Raja Azlan Shah, later Sultan Azlan Shah, wanted him for the national team.

Sadly, though, A. Selvarajah who stood at an imposing 6'2" did not make it into the squad.

But that is not something that was going to stop Selvarajah, the man known as "Tarzan". He has survived a lot more. He has lost two front teeth in a match and had stitches to his face, but never gave up.

Tarzan became a well known name in Johor hockey circles when Selvarajah began his hockey journey in Batu Pahat in 1972. He has former Johor hockey coach, the late Indran R. Nathan, to thank for his early rise.

The six-footer struck an fearsome figure as fullback on the hockey field and teammate Lim Chuan Seng, who had difficulty pronouncing his name, gave him the moniker "Tarzan".

"I was not into sports in my school days although every evening I would go to the football field for a kickabout just to lose weight. One day, Indran, who was coaching some hockey players on the adjacent field came over and gave me a hockey stick. "Indran must have been impressed with my brand of hockey and told me to switch as there was no prospect in football. I fell in love with the stick-and-ball game. Two years later I won a place in the state Under-23 team while playing for my district," added Selvarajah.

"I fell in love with the stick-andball game-thanks to coach Indran."

One thing led to another and Tarzan soon earned a place in the Johor senior team for the Razak Cup in 1976. His accuracy in converting penalty corners with power packed hits were the hallmarks of his game.

Selvarajah worked extra hard on his skills, hits during training in the evenings and in the mornings did cross-country runs to improve his fitness.

He has had his fair share of ups and downs in the game. A reverse hit by Chuan Seng during a match in Batu Pahat saw his losing two front teeth.

During an inter-district match in Segamat, he was rushed to hospital and needed five stitches for a wound when former international Balbir Singh's stick landed on his left cheek.



Selvarajah took all that in his stride - the hard knocks, the bruises and injuries - that come with the game.

However, the national team debacle remains the most painful episode of his life. The 69-year-old father of three, who has now settled down in Kulai, Johor, will remember the pain the rest of his life.

It was 1978 and he had played a sterling role in Johor's friendly match against Pakistan in Johor Baru. The Pakistanis struggled in the first half and could not score a single goal, with Tarzan standing resolutely in their way.

"Tarzan played the game of his life." said well known local sports journalist George Dass.

(Then) Malaysian Hockey Federation president Raja Azlan Shah, who was also Chief Justice of Malaysia, told him he has been selected for the World Cup in Buenos Aires, Argentina after being strongly recommended by Pakistani ace Rashid Junior.

Selvarajah went off to Kuala Lumpur where he trained for one month with the national squad. Then came the heartbreak.

"Only later I found out that the team had already been selected. It still hurts when I think of it ... because many already knew the team had already been selected." said Selvarajah, his voice tinged with sadness.

It was the same scenario when he was called up the 1977 SEA Games in Kuala Lumpur. Again, the team had already been selected but he was still told to report for training.

The bitterness is behind him now.



Selvarajah is married to Retha and has three sons. The eldest Viswanathan, 35, is an accountant in Kulai, while the second Previndnathan 30, and the third Navinathan 29, are marine engineers based in the United States and Brazil respectively.

He is still a success story despite his failure to be picked for the national team.

ARUL'S BIGGEST COACH - HIS TEACHER PERPINDER

Former international A. Arul Selvaraj - is back in the fold in the national hockey coaching setup after taking up the hot seat from Roelant Oltmans - and the chief coach takes pride to take Malaysia to next year's men's World Cup.

He joins the ranks of the late Ho Koh Chye, who guided Malaysia to fourth place in Kuala Lumpur in 1975, Malaysia's best ever placing in the world meet. Koh Chye also took Malaysia to World Cups in Amstelveen, Netherlands (1973) and Buenos Aires (1978).

Other local coaches who guided Malaysia to the World Cup are Datuk R. Yogeswaran (Bombay, 1982) and K. Dharmaraj (The Hague, 2014). Three foreign coaches - Germans Volker Knapp (Utretch, 1998) and Paul Lissek (Kuala Lumpur, 2002) and Dutchman Oltmans ((Bhubaneswar, 2018) achieved the same for Malaysia.

Now, Arul is on a mission to rewrite Malaysian hockey history in the World Cup in Bhubaneswar. Malaysia qualified for the world meet after finishing runnersup to South Korea in the Asia Cup in Jakarta in June this year. The Koreans won the final 2-1. It was a heartbreaking defeat for Arul and company.

The 15th edition of the World Cup will be played in Bhubaneswar and Rourkela in India from Jan 13-19. Malaysia are in Pool C that also includes the Netherlands, New Zealand and Chile.



Still, Arul is proud of the team's achievements and so is his former teacher and hockey coach Perpinder Singh at Segamat High School. Perpinder speaks fondly of Arul, both as a student and a hockey player.

"I have known Arul since his younger days. He is an individual who has all the qualities required as a player or as well as a coach. Arul as a player was very disciplined and hardworking. His attitude during hockey trainings was a plus factor, always willing to learn and take responsibilities when given a task.

It is not surprising that he is at present the national coach," says Perpinder, who was also the school's much feared discipline teacher.

Arul, who also hails from Segamat, Johor, is not new to the national team. He was the head coach for the 2010 Asian Games in Incheon, South Korea, and also handled the National Junior team. His last assignment with the juniors was the 2015 Junior Asia Cup in Kuantan, Pahang.

The former left-back comes with a wealth of experience and had coaching stints with the South Africa and Ireland national teams. He also ran his own AA Hockey Academy and was the technical director of the YMCA Hockey Club, both in Dublin.

Arul took the first flight out of Dublin on June 15 2020 when the borders were opened, to visit his parents. There were only 12 passengers on the Qatar Airways flight from Dublin to Dubai. From Dubai to KL there were 60 passengers.

While he was here he got a call from MHC president Datuk Sri Subahan Kamal for chit chat over a cup of tea and he asked if I was keen to be in the national coaching set-up. The rest is history.

"I took up the offer as it is an honour to be part of the coaching set-up and help my country," said Arul.

In the same breath, Arul said if there is one person who he would like to thank and has not forgotten is Perpinder, a former Johor player and was well known for playing the game barefoot and was nicknamed "kaki-ayam" for that.

"Perpinder was my school hockey coach. He was also the discipline master and he was also the one who forced me to be a school prefect. I owe him for what I am today," added Arul, recollecting his school days in Segamat.





"I had a very disciplined upbringing. My father was a no nonsense man and a very strict disciplinarian. Perpinder was next to my father. Both moulded me into what I am today. I am grateful for that."

"I learned hockey from Perpinder... owe him what I am today. As my former teacher I sincerely thank him for all that he did for me during my school days."

Arul had his fair shares of ups and downs in the national squad but he has shown a strong character to "move forward" in pursuit of glory.

"Hockey has been my passion. However, it is hard work with lots of sacrifices to be made on the personal front."

Arul is married to former national athlete K. Soloseeni. The couple is blessed with three girls - Tharine, 19, Erin Mridula, 13 and Deepa, 11. His family still resides in Dublin, Ireland.

"I have a wonderful wife who is capable of handling a family matter, knowing that my presence will be missed during special occasions," said Arul, who has found courage in pursuit of a life of real fulfillment to complete an unfinished job.



KAMARUDDIN AHMAD - A RARE BREED AS DOUBLE INTERNATIONAL

"We share the same DNA," says a proud Kamaruddin Ahmad, 65, - with pride on his family's involvement in sports at all levels.

Kamaruddin, a father of eight, himself is a rare breed double international, has donned national colours in football and hockey in the ball games.

As they say 'Like father, like son' - his three sons - Kamarul Afiq, Kamarul Ariffin and Kamarulzaman - are household names either in Malaysian football or hockey.

Afig, 36, the eldest, played for Johor Darul Ta'zil (JDT) and several other clubs in the Malaysian Football League while it is the stick and ball game for Kamarul Ariffin, 27 and Kamarul Zaman, 22. Both, Ariffin and Kamarulzaman are pillars in Johor's Razak Cup team.

Kamarulzaman, played a key role for Malaysia in winning the gold medal in the Hockey 5s 2018 Summer Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires with a stunning 4-2 win over favourites India. In the semis Malaysia staved off surprise package Zambia for a 7-4 win.

Kamaruddin revealed that his five daughters were also very much into sports but they chose to pursue

their respective careers in other fields.

Known for his unique, strong character, admits to having a rebellious streak. He also revealed why he finally chose football as his career instead of hockey.

"Without doubt football is a crowd puller. Matches were played at night to packed stadiums. There were also live telecast of matches... it's something not to be missed. Dream of many footballers to appear on television," said Kamaruddin, adding that he was torn between two sports he loved most.

"It was painful in many ways but I chose football over hockey. Hockey was more of social although I managed to find a place in the national team. The man who had an impact on my hockey is Pritam Singh (JHA official), who pushed me to take up the sport."

In the same breath, Kamaruddin said he did not want his children to undergo such situations and left it to themto decide on their choice. I did, however, tell them that there is no shortcut to success. They have to work through the hard way to achieve success.

Kamaruddin's hockey saw him play for the Johor U-20,U-23 and the, Razak Cup.sides. This earned him selection to the youth team in preparation for friendlies against Germany, Argentina for the 1977 World Cup qualifiers In Kuala Lumpur.

Malaysia qualified for the Finals in France in 1979 and finished a creditable fourth, losing to the Netherlands 2-1 in the playoff. The same Kamaruddin won the Sea Games hockey gold in Jakarta and a year later represented Malaysia in the Esanda hockey tournament in Australia.

In football Kamaruddin had an equal share of success playing for Malaysia in the Merdeka Tournament in 1985 and the 1985 Bangkok Sea Games. A year later donned national colours in the 1986 Asiad in Seoul, South Korea.

Representing Malaysia alongside Nurulhuda Abdullah (swimming), Misbun Sidek (badminton), Ishak Amin (cycling), Linda Kwan bowling, and Raj Kumar (athletics) is something he cherishes till today.

One football incident that will remain etched for the rest of his life is when Johor and Kelantan fans fought a running 'battle' in the terraces of the Larkin Stadium opposite the grandstand in 1987. There were several casualties with some taken to hospital for treatment. Johor won the match.

Coming back to hockey, Kamaruddin Kamarulzaman as one with leadership qualities who has acquired a taste for the game in a competitive atmosphere.

"He (Kamarulzaman) has good and accurate shots, is fast and energetic," says Kamaruddiin of his son, who has been called up to the senior national squad.







NIGHT OF ENORMOUS TRIUMPH FOR JOHOR SUKMA CONTINGENT

Johor wrote Malaysia Games (Sukma) history - clinching the overall title for the first time since its inception in 1986 - ending the 20th edition of the games with an impressive haul of 77 gold, 52 silver and 43 bronze. At the last Sukma held in Perak in 2018, the southern state finished ninth overall with a 29-34-37 tally.

Terengganu, the overall champions in 2018, could only manage a second placing this time around with figures of 64-49-56 while Federal Territories finished third with 55-68-64.

It was a night of enormous success for the Southern state when this year's edition came to a close at the Chancellor Tun Abdul Razak Hall, University Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) in Bangi on September 24.

> Two Johor athletes also walked away with the Best Sportsman and Best Sportswoman awards in this year's edition - as Johor gave strong signals as an emerging new powerhouse in Malaysian sports.

> > Competing in his last Sukma, 21-year-old rower Mohd Fakhrullah Mohd Rumaize, 21, won nine gold medals in the canoe events and along the way set two national records in the K2 500m (1:43.045s) K2 and 1000m (3:35.50s) to be named as the Best Sportsman.



Swimmer Tan Ronxin, who is only 16, making her debut, in national games, ruled the pool with six gold medals, one silver and one bronze. She won gold in the 50m breast stroke, 100m breast stroke, 200m breast stroke plus golds in the 100m back stroke, 200m back stroke, 200m individual medley.

The Form Four student has now set her sights on qualifying for next year's Sea Games in Cambodia.





JDT - KINGPINS OF **MALAYSIAN FOOTBALL**

Johor Darul Ta'zim (JDT) - popularly known as the Southern Tigers- continued to rule Malaysian football by clinching their ninth consecutive Malaysian Super League title since 2014.

It is a huge, huge success for the team which is owned by Johor Crown Prince His Highness Major-General Tunku Ismail Ibni Sultan Ibrahim, more so when JDT II had earlier won the lower-tier Premier League title.



The change of chief coach in mid-season had little effect on JDT when long-serving Mexican Benjamin Mora quit and was replaced by Hector Bidoglio from Venezuela.

For the record, JDT have won a total of 39 trophies over a nine year spell. After winning the Super League and the FA Cup the Southern Tigers have set their sights on a grand treble with an eye on the prestigious Malaysia

JDT also became the first Malaysian team to reach the knockout stage in the AFC Champions League before bowing out to Japanese giants Urawa Red Diamonds.



Besides the above success, the club has also won the FA Cup title with a 3-1 win over pretenders Terengganu. With a well structured setup that is bearing fruits, JDT III won the President's Cup and the National

The origins of the name Johor comes from the Arabic word 'JAUHAR' which means 'precious jewel' - recorded the highest investment in the country for the period from January to June this year, RM60.9 billion, an increase of 822% over the same period in 2021.

Chief Minister Datuk Onn Hafiz Ghazi said what has been achieved proves that Johor is capable of attracting high-tech and quality investments, thereby increasing the state's economy to a higher level.

The Mayor speaks with pride about the city which has a lot to offer - from heritage buildings and iconic landmarks - with a proud history that captures the glory of past eras.



> The Sultan Abu Bakar Mosque, which is more than 100 years old features a blend of Islamic and colonial design while the

interiors boast Roman pillars with big colonial-style windows that adorn the prayer hall. The single-layer pyramid-style roof is accompanied by four grand minarets.

The Johor Ancient Temple was built in the 19th century and stands resplendent with heritage between city skyscrapers and office towers. It has a rich history that dates back some 150 years and was built by Chinese community leaders.

Johor Bahru is also the home of the world-renowned annual Chingay parade that attracts thousands of visitors to this city. Chingay, also known as the "Parade of the Deities" unifies the five prominent Chinese clans in Johor Bahru - the Hakka, Hainan, Cantonese, Hokkien and Teochew.

Another iconic landmark in the heart of the city is the Arulmigu Rajamariamman Devasthanam Temple which is built on a piece of land donated by Sultan Ibrahim who also made a significant contribution to the construction. This temple was called Mariamman Temple when completed before the name was changed in 1985.

The Gurdwara Sahib Sikh Temple in Jalan Trus, Johor Bahru is the pride of the Sikh Community and the first Sikh Temple in the state that was constructed in 1921.



The Johor government contriibuted RM150,000 and the Lee Foundation RM100,000 towards the cost of a new Gurdwara Sahib building that cost RM1,300.000. The rest was raised from donations from the Sikh sangat in Malaysia and Singapore.

The Catholic Church of Immaculate Conception is the oldest church in the city. It has a touch of royalty as it is built on a piece of land that was graciously donated by His Highness Sultan Abu Bakar in 1883.

The Statue of Our Lady stands at the Church entrance and was donated by the late Sultan Ibrahim.



Food lovers can just about find their favourite food both Asian and Western, including typical American breakfast. Not to be left out Johor Bahru is a sports hub apart from being an education center.

Mayor Noorazam also revealed that for a healthy lifestyle and make the city more liveable the city council is in the midst building a RM3 million bicycle lane that would stretch along the Central Business District, Jalan Kolam Ayer, Jalan Tasek Utara and Jalan Yahya Awal.

Johor Bahru is the "Gateway to Mainland Asia" and is linked to neighbouring Singapore by the Causeway and the Second Link.


South Africa has also set their sights on the FIH Hockey Junior World Cup to be hosted by Malaysia in Kuala Lumpur in December next year.
